

THE CORNERSTONES OF VILLAGE LIFE ARE COMMUNITY AND ENVIRONMENT, TWO THINGS THAT AREN'T NECESSARILY SYNONYMOUS WITH THE HUSTLE AND BUSTLE OF SYDNEY LIFE. IN **EASTLAKES LIVE**, ELITE ARCHITECTURAL FIRM FRANCIS-JONES MOREHEN THORP AND CROWN GROUP ARE COLLABORATING TO REDEFINE VILLAGE LIFE AND COMMUNITY IN A MODERN CITY. **RAKHEE GHELANI** DISCOVERS HOW THEY ARE ACHIEVING THIS.

> Eastlakes is a hidden gem in Sydney's southeast. Surrounded by Randwick, Rosebery and Kingsford, it was only a matter of time before this local secret was uncovered. Now ripe for transformation, Crown Group has tasked architectural firm Francis-Jones Morehen Thorp (fjmt) with the challenge of revitalising this tired retail complex into an urban village that honours its community heritage while bringing it into the modern world.

Redefining urban lifestyle

Modern-day life is chaotic with little respite from harsh concrete and flashing neon lights. With this in mind, fjmt wanted to redefine urban lifestyle by bringing the organic environment into a residential world, creating a natural sanctuary. To achieve this, the fjmt team needed to reimagine how people interact with their local environment. Rather than separating the adjoining parklands and golf courses, fjmt integrated them into the design.

"We wanted to complement the landscape, not overpower it," explains Simon Barr, Principal at fjmt. "Our design blends the open parklands into both the residential and retail precincts. ►

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We've created a new canopy that integrates the park and breaks down the scale of the buildings so they feel human and inviting. The design also takes advantage of the views towards Moore Park Golf Course and the CBD."

Integrating community

Eastlakes is a tight-knit community. Many of its residents came from overseas and together they have created a unique multicultural landscape. It's this community that has inspired both the residential and retail design.

"It was important to us that the development was a good neighbour to the existing community. It integrates into their vibrant lifestyle and complements it," explains Barr. "We've achieved this on the retail side by creating a small scale and intimate shopping experience on Evans Avenue. The local community has an intimate connection with their retailers and we wanted to maintain and enhance this. There are also undercover awnings that will be filled with community dining and a large promenade adjoining the parklands."

This concept also appeals to newcomers. Alana Morton moved to the area with her husband, Shane and young daughter, Zara, drawn to the village environment. "We wanted to have the best of both worlds. The area has a areat suburban, community feel and it also has a growing café and restaurant precinct, which makes it exciting and lively," she comments.

Morton didn't know much about the area before she moved. "I used to drive past Eastlakes all the time but never stopped there. Now, like most locals, we spend a lot of time in the area," she continues. "To me, community is about people who want to spend time in the place they live in because they feel connected to it. In Eastlakes, you can see the locals sipping



coffee and playing in the parks. It's such a lovely environment to live in."

The appeal of the region goes beyond modern conveniences. "My husband loves that there are three or four golf clubs nearby and there are also plenty of parks for our daughter to play in," comments Morton, "We also appreciate the finer things in life and that's all about having choice. In this area we're spoilt for choice – we're close to the city, beaches and even our favourite gelato bar. The airport is just 15 minutes away and there's plenty of public transport, so we're never stuck in traffic. Living here is a lifestyle choice for us."

Appreciating the finer things

While the external spaces will set a new benchmark, Crown Group's vision for Eastlakes Live is to also epitomise luxury from within. Taking the award-winning Top Ryde City Living development as its inspiration, Crown Group set out to rejuvenate the concept of apartment life in Eastlakes. "With Top Ryde City Living, we
